Aussie Backyard Bird Count

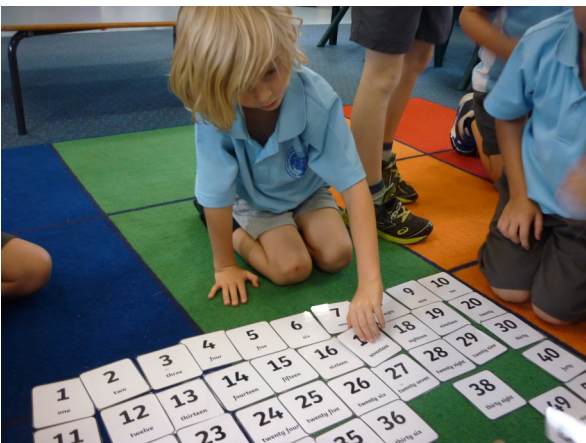
Once again, we registered for the Aussie Backyard Bird Count and have been spending twenty minutes each day counting and identifying the birds in our school grounds. The count continues to be the biggest citizen science project in our country, helping Birdlife Australia track how our birds are doing.

Junior Maths

We are continuing to use a range of strategies to add and subtract and to multiply and divide. The Junior class have had fun playing shops and learning to use money.



Everyday in our Maths class we learn to count forwards and backwards using a 100 chart. We look for patterns and play 'Guess the Number'. This week we have been putting a 100 chart back together.



Junior Sport

We have been practising our ball skills using catching, throwing and passing. We have also had fun learning some traditional outdoor games that involve chasing and catching.



Senior Art

In our Art class we have been using charcoal to create still life drawings. We have learnt that a still life drawing focuses on still objects that are typically household objects, flowers, or fruits.

This week we investigated the industrial revolution and how the invention of machines lead to job losses and choices that resulted in people being convicts.

Virtual Excursion

On Tuesday, Years 2-6 attended a virtual excursion held by the Sydney Museum. We were able to visit the Hyde Park Barracks and discover what life was like for the convicts living there.

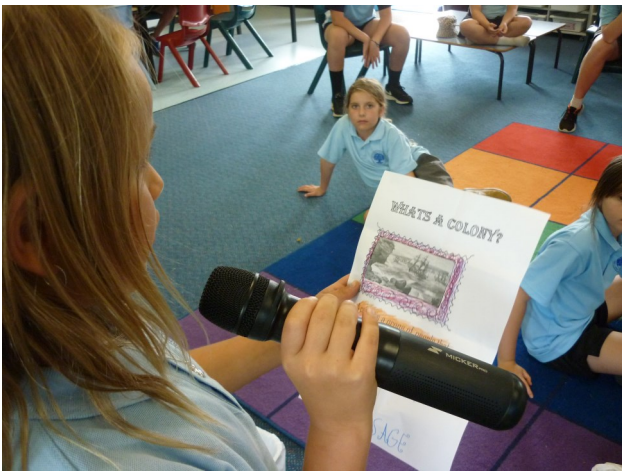
We met 'real-life' convicts and watched how they made sandstone bricks to build the colonies. We also heard about the tools they used to create shoes and clothing.



Inquiry

Our big questions in Inquiry learning this term are; **What can we learn from the past to take to the future?** and **How did an Australian colony develop over time and why?**

The learning will have a History focus. We have commenced our journey by investigating what the word 'colony' means.



We wondered why the convicts left England and moved to Australia and we researched what life was like during the journey on the hulks. Our students re-enacted life in England in the late 1700s.



We also used a thinking routine to 'step inside' a convict. This enabled us to write letters home to family explaining our thoughts, concerns and feeling.

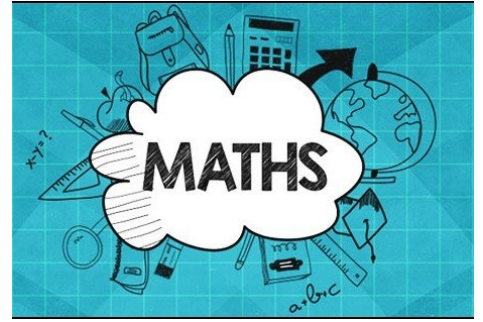


Junior Art

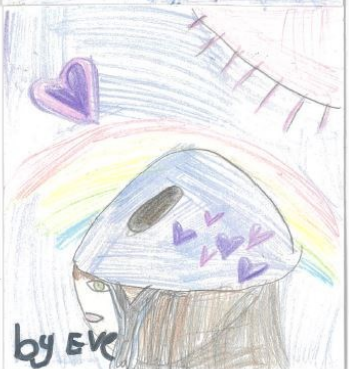

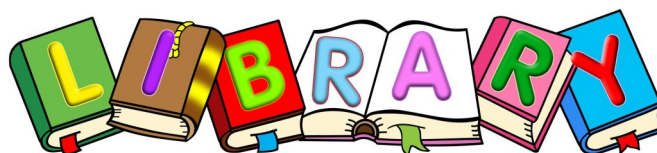

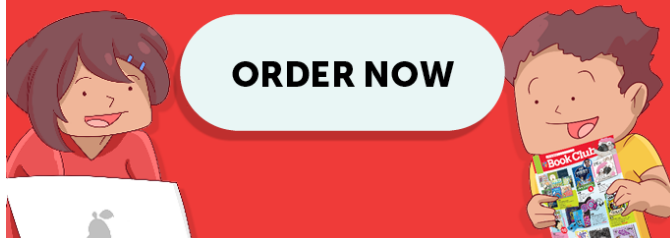
