Year 6 Graduation

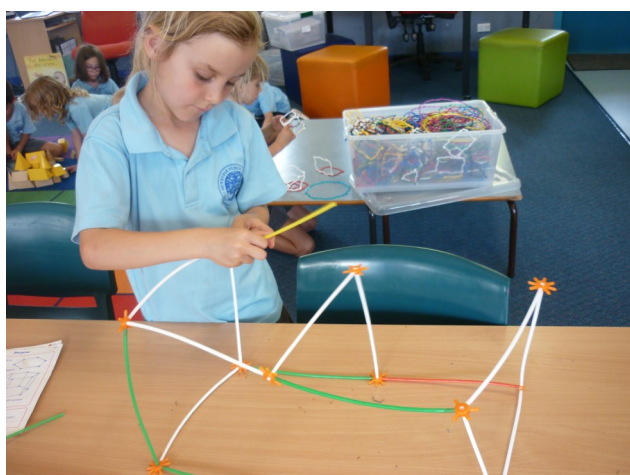

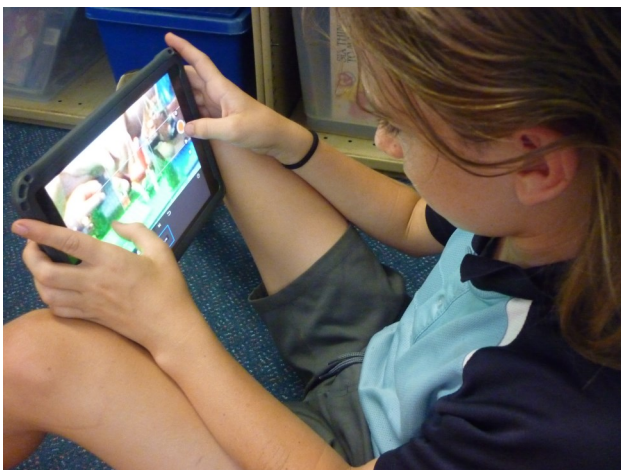
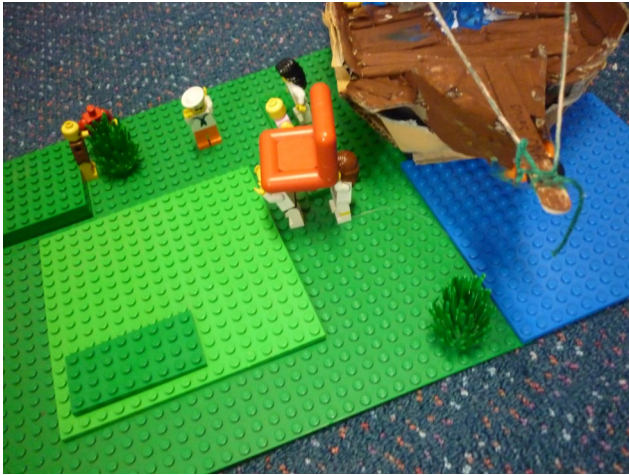
Junior Art

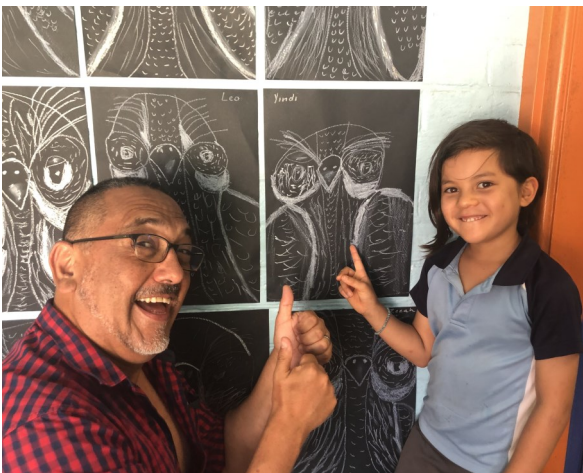


ART Show

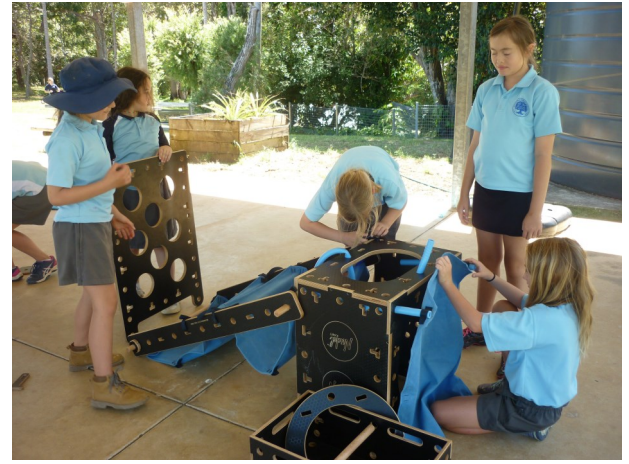
Dorroughby Arts Camp
