K-1 Maths






This week we read the story of the *Mixed up Chameleon.* We used line drawings and drops of dye to create our own colour-change chameleons.










Pen Pals

The workshop was delivered by staff from the local Firewheel Rainforest Nursery. Highlights included squishing the beautiful purple Dianella fruit, sewing Banksia seeds, and potting up some Davidson plum seedlings. The aim is to plant some of the seedlings in the school grounds.

A series of workshops will culminate in a one day free community festival at the Mullumbimby Community Gardens, on March 4, 2023, called *Regeneration*, funded by the NSW Government's Reconnecting Regional NSW grant.
